F.Y.I.:

We quote the following caution from the Gaines Dog Research Center: "During the warm summer months, dog owners

are advised . . . to pay particular attention to flea control devices. They provide protection against fleas by releasing chemicals which are absorbed into the animal's body.

"If a device becomes wet, chemicals are released in greater quantities. This can have an effect on the dog's nervous system. If a flea collar or medallion gets wet, the Center advises that it be taken off immediately and not replaced until dry."
