The big New York week-end February 11-12 went off as scheduled -- ITCA Specialty, Club meetings, and Westminster.

First, news of the shows. At the Specialty, judging began shortly after 10 a.m. Saturday. George Van Duyne had painted an attractive placard for the trophy-laden ring table, announcing the show as the Rudolph Jensen Memorial in honor of our late veteran member from Chicago.

We had a good entry of 32 (3 absentees) for judge Anne Rogers Clark. For Best of Breed she selected Richard and Sharie Diamond's Carris's Watch Me, a son of Ch. Foxglove Barnaby out of Goswyre Music Mistress, from the Open Class. Best of Opposite Sex, selected from the 6-9 months old Puppy Class, was Kincora's Kerry Ann Girl, another offspring of Ch. Foxglove Barnaby, out of Riley's Meggin O'Shay, owned by Joseph M. O'Connor and Susan G. Young. Susan handled her.

Next day at Westminster, at Madison Square Garden, Ch. Foxglove Barnaby demonstrated that he could win big shows as well as produce winners, by going Best of Breed under judge Dr. David G. Doane. "Barney", who is owned by Michael B. Cole, is by McCarthy's Banny Taig out of Kilvara Drureen.

Best of Opposite Sex at Westminster went to Richard and Sharie Diamond's Carris's See Me Go, another daughter of Ch. Foxglove Barnaby, and a litter sister of the Specialty winner, Carris's Watch Me.

Winners Bitch and Best of Winners at Westminster was Kincora's Kerry Ann Girl, the previous day's BOS. Winners Dog was Mrs. R. C. Mackeown's Ruff N Rowdy.

Following the Specialty judging on Sunday, at the State Armory, ITCA members and their families gathered in one of the meeting rooms for a delightful buffet luncheon, prepared, toted to the show and served by several ladies of the Club to whom we are most grateful.

After the tables were cleared, ITCA President Michael Gately called the annual meeting to order. There were 39 members present,

NOTES


