1946 STATISTICS ON IRISH SHOWING

The licensed shows at which Irish terriers could have been shown From original in the University of Vermont Library. May not be in 1946 numbered 252, as compared to 136 in 1945; an increase of 85%. Irish did not keep pace with this rapid growth in shows, registering an increase of 54% in the number of shows patronized. This growth, expressed in different terms, is revealed by the fact that in 1945 Irish were present at 103 licensed shows, while in 1946 they were present at 159 shows.

With regard to the density with which Irish were shown in 1946, as compared to 1945, the following table shows no marked variation or trend which could be considered significant for such a limited period.

During 1946 no Irish terrier won Best in Show. Irish won seven Terrier Groups during the year; were six times second; five times third; and twelve times fourth.

BIG ENTRY AT MORRIS AND ESSEX

To a degree even greater than expected members responded to the appeal for a big entry at the 1947 Morris and Essex Show, coming through with an entry of 65, which exceeded by five the best previous (1938) M and E turnout and assured the inclusion of Irish in next year's Madison classification. ENGLISH JUDGE ON U.S. IRISH

Irish Terrier breeders on this side of the Atlantic will be interested in the impressions of Mrs. Cora Charters of Dorney Lodge, Windsor, England, who judged the record entry at the Club's 50th Anniversary Show in February. Writing in the England "Dog World," she says:

"I was pleasantly surprised to find them much better than I had been led to believe. . . . Many good ones come to my mind, including two whose names I don't remember; they were beautiful dogs with exceptional heads but failing in coat, for which I had to penalize them. Coat appears to be most important in this breed, more so than in most. My opinion in Irish Terriers is that they want to pay more attention to eyes, which can make or mar expression in this hard-bitten terrier."

Mrs. Charters refers to the specialty winner as a "beautiful dog, full of Irish Terrier type, grand head, perfect neck and shoulders, wonderful movement." And describes the best of opposite sex as "a lovely bitch with wonderful expression and glorious color; should have a great future."
